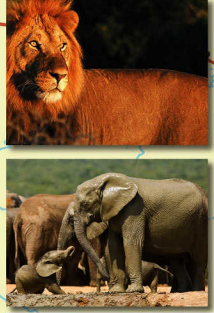

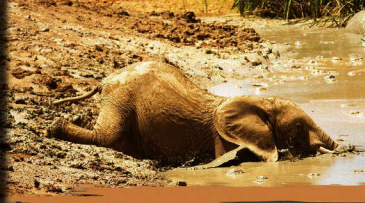

- Darlington Area:**
 - 4x4 Trail (bookings done at Addo Main Camp reception)
 - Fishing in Darlington Dam
 - Accommodation: basic Camping facilities (bookings done at Addo Main Camp reception)
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, specials include arid Karoo species and water birds.
- Kabouga Area:**
 - 4x4 Trail (bookings done at Addo Main Camp reception)
 - Accommodation: Mvubu Campsite – a rustic campsite alongside the river
 - Kabouga Cottage – high clearance vehicle required to access the cottage (bookings done at Addo Main Camp reception)
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for cliff breeding species, thickets species and water birds.
- Zuurberg Area:**
 - Guided Horse Trails, including an overnight horse trail to Narina Bush Camp
 - Hiking Trails
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for grassland forest and fynbos species.
 - Accommodation: Narina Bush Camp
- Nyathi Area:**
 - Self catering, fully equipped family cottages
 - Scouted along a ruggedly breathtaking views of elephants and buffalo at the waterhole.
 - Bearded ibis, an invasive thicket in Nguni styled architecture.
 - Small private Nyathi pool.
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for thickets and grassland species.

- Addo Main Camp Area:**
 - Game viewing in the Wildlife area
 - Self Drives in the Wildlife area
 - Guided Horse Trails (enquiries & bookings done at Game Drives Office)
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for thickets and grassland species. Also, check out the Bird Hide!
 - PPC Discovery Trail (Wheelchair friendly)
 - Underground viewing hide (in waterhole opposite the restaurant)
 - Picnic & braai sites in the wildlife area and in front of the waterhole opposite the restaurant.
 - Lowest Interpretive Centre
 - Shop that sells curries and basic commodities.
 - Restaurant
 - Fuel station
 - Public Accommodation (self-catering) Campsites & Caravan sites, Safari Tents, Rondavels (with a view of the waterhole), Forest Cabins, Chalets, Cottages, Hagan & Drinking Guest Houses and Speckboom Tented Camp.
- Colchester Area:**
 - Game viewing in your own vehicle
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for thickets and grassland species.
 - Accommodation: 12 Thatched Cottages, self-catering
 - Shop, restaurants and fuel available at Colchester Village
 - 5 km of the Cape
 - Fishing, boating, canyoning and ferry trips are offered in the Colchester area. Enquire at reception for more information.
- Woody Cape Area:**
 - Langebos Forestry Flats provide a base camp for the hike and are equipped with beds and mattresses, gas fridge & stove, hot water shower, toilet, braai area and cooking & eating utensils.
 - Birding: A birding enthusiast's paradise, look for forest and marine species.

8. Proposed Marine Protected Area:
The Marine Section of Addo Elephant National Park currently consists of the Bird Island and St. Croix Island groups. The 120 000 Cape Gannet colony on Bird Island is the largest in the world. The Bird Island group is a current MPA. A larger MPA is proposed for the protection of declining penguin and fish populations. There are about 6 500 breeding pairs of critically endangered African penguins on St. Croix Island; the largest breeding colony in the world. The Southern Right Whale and Great White Shark in these waters complete Addo Elephant National Park's 'Big 7'. Pods of Bottlenose Dolphins, Turquoise Princes, are a common sight in the waves along the shores of this coastline.

Note: Trips to Bird Island are not offered to visitors due to the ecological sensitivity of the islands. Whale watching boat trips are only offered by private licensed whale watching operators in Port Elizabeth and not by the Park. Accredited operators available on request.

Botanical Reserve
Addo's Pond Site is an old disturbed area within the 100 hectares Botanical Reserve. It is a protected area set aside to monitor the impact of megaherbivores - particularly elephants - on the subtropical thicket vegetation. Plant species and vegetation structure within this reserve are compared with similar areas outside this reserve to monitor long term effects.
